1. Theatre UNB presents *Buried Child* by Sam Shepard Feb 2-5

One of the most acclaimed American plays of the late twentieth century will take the stage at UNB February 2-5 as Theatre UNB presents *Buried Child* by Sam Shepard. Winner of the 1979 Pulitzer Prize for drama, *Buried Child* offered an unsettling, macabre, and at times darkly comic portrait of a deeply dysfunctional

American family, at a time when the nation was confronting many unpleasant truths in the wake of Watergate and the Vietnam War.

In the play, an anticipated happy reunion takes unpredictable turns and sparks disturbing revelations. Vince, a jazz musician living in New York, brings his new girlfriend, Shelly, to the Illinois farm where he grew up to introduce her to his family. When he arrives, he finds the household in a state of chaos and violence and discovers that no one, not even his father or grandfather, recognizes him. The presence of Shelly, the outsider, forces the family to confront a dark secret that has haunted and maimed the family for decades, and the final unearthing of the truth brings a conclusion as horrifying as it is inevitable.

Shepard's American heartland in *Buried Child* is both grotesque and beautiful, filled with alcoholics, amputees, lonely highways, and barren fields that suddenly and mysteriously bring forth bumper crops of corn and carrots. This surreal and gritty world will be brought to life on stage by the students of Drama 3170, UNB's advanced theatre class, under the direction of professor Len Falkenstein.

*Buried Child* will be performed at 8pm nightly, Wednesday, February 2 through Saturday, February 5 at Memorial Hall on the UNB campus. Tickets (\$10 regular / \$6 for students) are available at the door.

### 3. artsnb juried programs next deadline April 1, 2011

The New Brunswick Arts Board (artsnb) has announced the next deadline for its juried programs. **April 1, 2011 is the application deadline for the following four programs:** Creation, Documentation, New Brunswick/Quebec Creative Residency, and New Brunswick/Manitoba Creative Residency.

**The Creation Grant Program** is designed to provide assistance to individual emerging, mid-career, and senior professional New Brunswick artists for the research, development, and execution of original projects in the arts. Creation Grants are intended to allow artists to devote some or most of their time to research and creative production. Eligible applications are evaluated through a jury by discipline.

**The Documentation Grant Program** is designed to provide assistance to professional New Brunswick artists and arts professionals for the research, development, and execution of original documentation of arts activities, arts products, or art history for archival purposes. Preference will be given to proposals related to New Brunswick art or artists. Eligible applications are evaluated through a jury by discipline.

**The New Brunswick/Québec Creative Residency** and the **New Brunswick/Manitoba Creative Residency** agreements establish an annual exchange program that provides professional artists and writers with opportunities for creation and professional development residencies in the participating province. Artists and writers participating in these programs enjoy complete autonomy and define the objectives of their period of residence and elaborate the parameters and conditions governing its realization in collaboration with an arts or community organization in the territory where the period of residence is to take place. Eligible applications are evaluated by juries set up by each of the partners.

These competitions are open to those working in craft, literary arts, media arts, performing arts (dance, music, storytelling and theatre), and visual arts. Applicants must meet the eligibility criteria for the above programs. All admissible applications will be evaluated through a jury by discipline or by a multidisciplinary jury selected from a list of jurors approved by artsnb. The results of the competitions will be announced approximately three months following the closing date.
